News in brief

The Stobart Rail depot and yard which has been set up on Sutton estate land near the level crossing is serving as a base for repair operations on the rail bridge over the river and canal downstream at Marsh Benham. The operation is expected to last six weeks.

The new house which is nearly completed on the site of the demolished Holtwood House has been named Holtwood Corner.

The village hall is expecting to make a further insurance claim against last year's break-in and flooding because, on drying out, the sink unit and work-top have buckled.

The hall floor is due to be sanded and rewaxed on 31st August as part of the hall's maintenance programme to preserve improvements carried out in previous years.

Hamstead Hornet

Distributed free in the Hamstead Marshall area



Newbury Buses has continued to provide the No 13 service through the village, but no explanation could be obtained as to what caused the fire. Royal Berkshire Fire and Rescue declined to comment or confirm its involvement with any kind of investigation, referring the Hornet to the formal process of a Freedom of Information request.

Following its transfer to a new estate agent – Brunsden Associates – the White Hart has been sold subject to contract.

Details of the deal are confidential at present but, when asked if the White Hart would continue to be a pub, a Brunsden contact said "As far as I am aware, yes." This is good news for locals, and it has done nothing to dampen the strong rumour that the buyer is connected to the Red House at Marsh Benham.



The White Hart, or Old White Hart as it has sometimes been called, has long been the centre of village life. In the nineteenth century beer was brewed on site here, and the inn also provided a meeting place for fawn suppers, coroner's inquests, auctions, local societies' gatherings and annual rent days, when tenants queued up to pay the Craven bailiff. Had the site been redeveloped, as was feared, the loss to the village and its history would have been irrevocable.

It may look like downtown Baghdad, but this was the scene outside the Craven Arms in Enborne at 5.30pm on 18 August. The driver of Newbury Buses service no 13 was heading back into Newbury - fortunately with no passengers when he smelt burning electrics, stopped and got out. Within a minute or two the bus was ablaze, and within 10 minutes, when the fire brigade arrived, it was burnt out.
