Also in November the White Hart held a wine-tasting supper, to be repeated in January.


## Broadband update from Frank Ellis

There have been reports, all so far from the Chapel Corner end of the village, that the Vodafone broadband speed has recently increased. When this system was first installed locally 0.6 - 1Mb was the usual range obtained, but more recent tests have recorded 1 - 2Mb, and occasionally even 2.5Mb. There can of course be wide variation depending upon time of day (reflecting general usage of the signal) and perhaps also weather conditions.

When asked, Vodafone had no explanation for this other than a general assurance of continual service improvements.

We are not sure that the improvement applies across the whole village. ## Meet Andrew

### the new general manager at the White Hart Inn

Andrew North has recently taken over management of the White Hart Inn, four months after its rebirth last summer.

He hails originally from Essex, where as a school-leaver he gained City and Guilds qualifications in panel-beating and welding, with a view to going into the family business. However, it was not long before metalworking lost him to the hospitality trade, which he found more suited to his talents. He now has specialised experience in the sector of smaller, independent hotels and restaurants. Most recently he has been working in Bedford, from where his wife Andrea and two sons aged three and five will shortly be coming to join him living at the White Hart.

His sons have been enrolled at Kintbury school for next term, and Andrea, a sales manager in hotels, has yet to decide where to employ her talents locally but, says Andrew, she is unlikely to be a lady of leisure for long.

A flyer is inserted with this issue of the Hamstead Hornet, inviting local residents to meet the new general manager and to enjoy a complimentary drink (see terms). The White Hart Inn has made a donation to the village hall in return for circulation of this flyer.



If Andrew himself finds any leisure time it is likely to be spent fishing, which is his chief interest outside work. He is also a black-belt judo instructor, although work demands have more or less eliminated this from his timetable these days.

Andrew's plans for the White Hart centre on continuing to re-establish it as a genuine community pub, welcoming drinkers and diners equally, and serving good, straightforward food.

## Ash Tree Corner parking no more Mr Nice Guy...

At the November meeting of the parish council it was confirmed that Thames Valley Police will soon start ticketing cars which park at the Ash Tree Corner junction obstructing motorists' sightlines. This issue has been a safety concern for many months, during which it seems that common sense has failed to resolve the problem.

Meanwhile the parish council is in contact with Sovereign Housing Association to push for more parking provision, in particular to compensate for the places which local residents lost when the Kintbury Road garages site was sold.

## New parish clerk

Joanne Wheeler, who has served as Hamstead Marshall's parish clerk since 2007, has submitted her resignation. The parish council's advertisement for a new clerk attracted 10 applications, which have been whittled down to a shortlist of three. Interviews are currently taking place to make the final selection.

It is hoped that the new clerk will be in post in time for the January meeting, which will be Joanne's last.

## Planning applications

### Land adjacent to 23 Hamstead Marshall

Application 11/01857/FUL to create off-road parking and (temporary) access to Sunnyside field on scrubland within the curtilage of Elm Farm has been approved.

**Red Hill Cottage** Application 11/01721/HOUSE to build a new garage and adjoining store has been approved.

**The White Hart Inn** Two applications 11/01207/FUL and 11/01188/FUL for conversion of existing outbuildings to provide disabled accommodation have been approved.

**50-51 Craven Hill** Applications 11/02140/HOUSE and 11/02142/LBC2 to extend the existing brick boundary wall and instal a timber gate are pending consideration.

**White Hart Cottage** Application 11/02299/HOUSE to extend an existing garage to accommodate a living room, bedroom, WC

and bathroom is pending consideration.

**Ash Tree Cottage** Application 11/02191/HOUSE to demolish a single-storey extension on the western side of the house, and to replace it with a new extension and summer house, is pending consideration.

**The Old Post Office** Application 11/01327/LBC to build a new single-storey garage and out-building has been refused on the grounds that successive modernisations to this Grade II listed property have reached its maximum potential.

**East Gate Cottage** Application 11/02356/HOUSE for a single-storey extension and other alterations was received on 3 November, but the usual documents have not yet been posted on the WBC website. This application follows the withdrawal of an application made in August for a two-storey replacement dwelling.

## NEWS IN BRIEF

The Harvest Supper and auction, attended by more than 40 at the village hall at the end of October, raised the record sum of £1,373 for St Mary's Church.

Henrietta Buckwell and Julie Althaus, who between them have clocked up half a century as caterers for the Harvest Supper, have announced their wish to step down. Grateful thanks were expressed by the supper organisers.

The White Hart Inn is advertising in the local press and online for a general assistant, bar and waiting staff.

Lanie Allen's oil group has been held up as a model by the Citizens Advice Bureau in its advice to people seeking the best deal on heating oil purchase. A CAB press release on the subject was taken up by

BBC News, as a result of which Lanie was interviewed. Lanie's club, which she set up six years ago, now has more than 400 members subscribing £10 a year to benefit from bulk-buy prices.

Sue Watt's trip to see *The Snow Queen* ballet at Arlington Arts Centre in December has now sold out. The 32 ticket-buyers are mostly from the village, and span three generations.

Carol-singers have three opportunities this Christmas: at 6pm on 4th December there is a Christingle service in St Mary's Church; at 4.30pm on Sunday 18th December there is a service of nine lessons and carols, also in St Mary's; and on Thursday 22nd December from 7pm you can go carol-singing around Chapel Corner with Sarah Ward's group.
