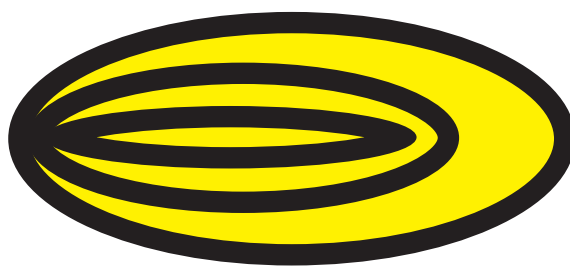

Nearly £1,000 raised by Friends

Activities organised by the Friends of Hamstead Marshall and Marsh Benham have raised £928.50 for Enborne and Stockcross schools, St Mary's Church and the Newbury branch of the Motor Neurone Disease Association since their inaugural meeting in February.



Local families flocked to the barn dance at Elm Farm on 20th May. The bands Caper and Misspent Ukles played from 5.30pm until 10 for 50 adults and 22 children. £487.50 was raised here for MND.

Two villagers mourned

After the thanksgiving service for Robin Althaus, 7th May



Hamstead Marshall has lost two long-standing residents in recent months.

Rob Bowyer of Chapel Corner had lived in the village for many decades. In business with his brother, Rob was well known as a skilled carpenter. His woodwork for St Mary's Church included an altar table in the north aisle, commissioned for the millennium, porch gates to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee, and new south gate after the old one was vandalised. For the village hall he supplied the sign outside and a large display board inside. His funeral was held in Inkpen.

Robin Althaus died at the beginning of May, and a thanksgiving service for him on Sunday 7th May at St Mary's was attended by over 100 people. A collection afterwards raised £780, which is to be used for a memorial bench. Robin was a devoted supporter of St Mary's Church, serving as a church warden and on the parochial church council for many years. In his eulogy Robin Tandy summed him up as "working tirelessly in support of the church for a quarter of a century, and we should all be very grateful. He was a good friend, full of energy, good humour, enthusiasm and ideas, and always with the sole aim of doing his very best for our church and the benefice."

Village property on the market

Holtwood Corner, a six-bedroomed, 2010-built house in 17 acres, continues to be offered for sale by Strutt & Parker. The guide price of £3,950,000 is unchanged.

Common Cottage is being offered by Winkworth for £1,250,000. The four-bedroomed house, formerly two Craven estate cottages, lies in grounds of 5.79 acres.

Hamstead Holt Farm ("Porters" to older villagers, and actually now outside Hamstead) is under offer with Jackson-Stops at a guide price of £1,750,000.

Thames Waterworks

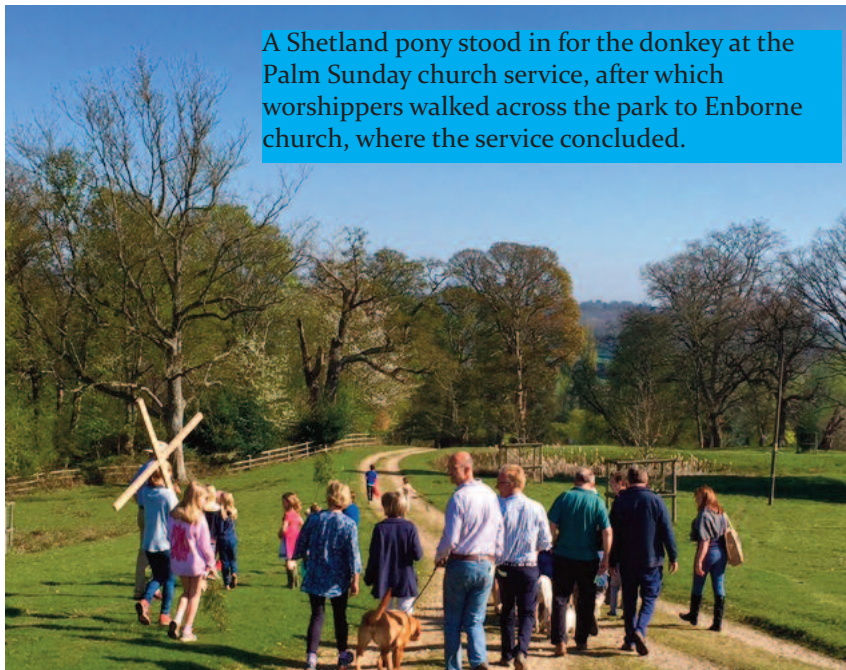

New noticeboard for Chapel Corner

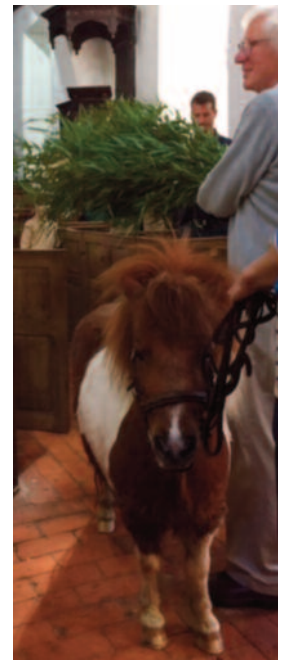
Chapel Corner at last has a brand new noticeboard. Unlike the last, it is locked, so should not suffer from commercial flyposting.
