St Mary's: traditional services still on hold



Lockdown regulations required cancellation of the customary Remembrance Sunday service in St Mary's this year, but a handful of parishioners observed the traditional reading out of the names of Hamstead's war dead at the church. Also on Remembrance Sunday morning, a small number of local residents gathered spontaneously for an unofficial wreathlaying ceremony at the memorial stone in Hamstead Park.

Strict distancing was observed in both cases, and neither occasion was advertised, being entirely spontaneous and voluntary on the part of those concerned.

The memorial stone in the park was unveiled in September 2003, commemorating US forces of the 501st Parachute Infantry Regiment, which camped in the park from January until D-Day in June 1944, after which they parachuted into Normandy, sustaining heavy losses.





St Mary's is undergoing uncertain times, with the combination of a possible transition out of the benefice, a vacancy in the rectory (priest-in-charge Rev Mark Wilson left in September) and the Tier-2 ban on congregational gathering. The usual Christmas services cannot be held this year, but the parochial church council is maintaining the building and grounds with a view to resuming normal activity as soon as is legally possible.
